To be eligible for a Fulton County Employees' Association Scholarship, an applicant must: be a member in good standing, be a college or graduate student of a member in good standing, provide/present a reference letter, present evidence of being in college; and have a dedication of giving back to the community through community service. The scholarship has existed for over a decade and funded by the Association through hosting Pop-Up Shops (Bazaars), receiving donations and sponsoring fundraisers for funding of the scholarship.

We are proud to announce that on December 22, 2022, we provided fourteen scholarships to members and their family members in the amount of \$400.00 each. We hosted an in-person luncheon for the recipients and family members. This was also achieved through donations from other organizations, small businesses, and vendors. We are proud of our accomplishments but there is much work to do. Our goal is to increase our annual scholarship each year to help families achieve their educational goals.



MEMBERS EDITION QUARTER 1 2023

Christmas Jello Salted Caramel Chocolate Martini

Ingredients

- 1 C. Ice
- 1/2 C. Godiva Chocolate Liqueur
- 1/4 C. Creme De Cocoa
- 1/2 C. Caramel flavored Vodka
- 1/2 C. Whole Milk 2% also works well for less fat
- Garnishments:
- Caramel Syrup for rim of martini glass
- 1/4 C. Crushed Pretzels
- Optional Garnishments:
- 4 Caramel Candies dipped in Coarse-Ground Sea Salt
- Milk Chocolate Bar to make chocolate curls for top of drink

Directions:

- 1 Prepare Martini glasses by placing a layer of caramel sauce and crushed pretzels on separate plates.
- 2 Dip and turn rims of martini glasses into caramel sauce until evenly coated.
- 3 Dip caramel-coated glass rims into pretzel crumbs until evenly coated.
- 4 Place ice in a Martini Shaker.
- 5 Add Godiva Chocolate Liqueur, Creme De Cocoa, Caramel Vodka and Milk.
- 6 Shake vigorously for around 30 seconds.
- 7 Strain Martini into prepared glasses.
- 8 Optional Garnishments:
- 9 Add desired amount of shaved milk chocolate curls (using a vegetable peeler; shave chocolate bar across the long edge of the candy bar).
- 10 Dip fronts and backs of caramel candies into a small bowl of coarsely ground sea-salt until coated.
- 11 Place 2 caramels on a cocktail pick and place in martini (adds a great touch of salt flavor).

This Salted Caramel Chocolate Martini is an absolute dream in a glass. The Godiva Chocolate Liqueur is so creamy and delicious on it's own, but add Crème de Cocoa and Caramel Vodka to the mix...pure sinful delight.




